
Northside Kids' Clothes Closet

Over the years God has been very good to us and we've been able to do interesting and challenging things for our church. But as we head to the New Year we will be faced with some tough budget reductions based on the commitment cards we have received. We hope not to have to make these. May we continue to live and give faithfully in this New Year, anticipating continued blessings from God!

You are our history, our present and our future. We need to continue to encourage giving and attending Trinity. You are also our ambassadors. When you speak positively about Trinity, you share a long history of community, family and faith.
