Ecclesiastes 3:1 "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven"

This time of year, we Midwesterners say it something like this:

"If March comes in like a lion, will it go out like a lamb?"
Sandy Duncan, from The Farmers' Almanac answers this
question this way:

"Is there any truth to this saying??? Weather sayings are as colorful as our imagination. While many

sayings are based on careful observations and turn out to be accurate, others are merely rhymes or beliefs of the people who came before us.

Those people often believed that bad spirits could affect the weather adversely, so they were cautious as to what they did or did not do in certain situations. Those beliefs often included ideas that there should be a balance in weather and life. So, if a month came in bad (like a lion), it should go out good and calm (like a lamb).

With March being such a changeable month, in which we can see warm spring-like temperatures or late-season snowstorms, you can understand how this saying might hold true in some instances. We can only hope that if March starts off cold and stormy it will end warm and sunny, but the key word is hope. However, this saying seems be to more of a rhyme rather than a true weather predictor."

While we can't predict the weather, we can proclaim that no matter how March comes in, it's going out with a lamb – the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! The end of March leads us into Holy Week, beginning with the Triumphal entry of Jesus on Palm Sunday, through the events of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and the celebration of this resurrection on Easter Sunday! And that makes the weather pale in comparison!

May March bring you the weather you've been hoping for, but more importantly, may your Journey to the Cross this Lenten Season bring you closer to the heart of God and give you the joy only Jesus can give.

### 40 Days of Lent—the Journey to the Cross and Empty Tomb

Midweek Lenten services focus on Prayer, one of the disciplines of Lent. Wednesday at 11:00 am we gather to learn about and pray the Lord's Prayer. At 7:00pm we gather to participate in the ACTS method of prayer: Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving and Supplication, and learn a creative prayer method that can be used to enhance our prayer lives throughout the week. Adding to the sense of community, there is a light lunch served after the 11:00 service and supper at 5:30 before the 7:00 service. All are welcome to attend!

### **Services during Holy Week**

Palm Sunday services will be held Saturday evening at 5:30, and Sunday morning at 8:30 and 10:30., March 28/29. A special jazz celebration service is on the schedule for Sunday at the 8:30 service—mark your calendars and bring your friends and family! Maundy Thursday services will be held at 11:00am and 7:00pm on April 2nd, with the stripping of the altar at the 7:00 service only.
