Erik Feig Lead Pastor Mark 16 "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. 7 But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." 8 So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

This is the joyous proclamation of the Christian community this time of year. We dare to believe and proclaim that Jesus of Nazareth is no longer dead, but alive – resurrected by God! It's an amazing proclamation, and it's amazing that we have this to proclaim. What do I mean? Take a look at the Gospel of Mark – the women who were with Jesus at his cross and watched him die were also at his tomb three days later to witness his resurrection. But did you catch their response? "So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid." Terror. Amazement. Silence. A far cry from our present day Easter celebrations, don't you think?

Yet that is the story of the church, the story of those who would claim the name Christian and follow Jesus. He goes ahead of us, with the promise to meet us as we move forward. And that can be a frightening thing, especially if you don't quite know where you're going or what the future might hold. Like the women at the tomb, we could get fearful and let ourselves be consumed by the unknown – or we could step out in faith and truly trust that Jesus is alive and leading us as we go forward. That's what the women must have done, eventually. Eventually their fear was overcome by faith, for the message of Jesus' resurrection wasn't kept to themselves, but shared with others – coming to us through centuries of the faithful who continue to proclaim the Good News. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

So we're challenged to look at the future through the eyes of faith, the eyes of resurrection hope. As a church, as a people, as a community of faith we have a God who is not dead but alive, calling us to meet him in places and in ways we never could have expected. Now it's our turn to hear God's voice speak to us: "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. 7 But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you."

Let's go. Let's be the church, together. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Thursday, April 2: Maundy Thursday services will be held 11:00AM and at 7:00PM on April 2.

"Maundy"??


Maundy Thursday can also be referred to as "Holy Thursday". It commemorates the Last Supper when Jesus shared the Passover meal with his disciples. the word "Maundy" comes from the Latin word mandatum, meaning "commandment". Maundy refers to the commands Jesus gave his disciples at the Last Supper: to love with humility by serving one another and to remember his sacrifice.

Friday, April 3; 5-7:30pm: Good Friday will be a time for your own self directed, spiritual journey, so come anytime between 5 and 7:30. There will be booklets provided for you to read and reflect on the <u>Stations of the Cross</u> set up in the sanctuary.

Did you know?

The Stations of the Cross is a way for us to remember the last hours of Jesus' life as he carried his cross from the Hall of Pilate to the site of his execution. It is a meditation of worship and an act of devotion to God. In remembering this event we are making our own journey and confessing our own dependence upon God.

Sunday, April 5: We celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the death of the cross! Sunrise service at 6:30AM. Easter services at 8:30 and 10:30AM


