

EMERGENCY SHELTER

Did you know in Wisconsin 6 shelters were opened last year in Green Bay, Madison, Milwaukee, and Platteville. La Crosse last opened shelters 6 years ago for the tornado. There have been some brief sheltering more recently (a few hours) for warming and evacuations locally.

Social Ministry has been thinking about TLC becoming an Emergency Shelter for the past couple years. In November this past year social ministry met with Dan Schreiter with the La Crosse Area Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster to explore the idea of sheltering. We learned the process to move forward and contacts for helping with the process. It was brought to the council in December of last year and was approved to move forward. The American Red Cross Coordinates sheltering so we met with John Halverson a Red Cross Volunteer for a walk through survey of the facility in

January. Discussed again at Social Ministry and Council. Met a second time with John and finalized an Emergency Shelter agreement. The Red Cross will coordinate and staff any and all sheltering that might occur at TLC. TLC volunteers will assist as able. Training is available for those interested in helping. Be watching for more information on this as we will be offering some training soon.

SEWING FOR JESUS

First Free Church, 123 Mason St in Onalaska is hosting sewing events to make sustainable hygiene kits used by young women in Uganda. These kits are distributed by the organization Days for Girls International - imagine, for these young women, not being able to go to school because you have your period and have no supplies to use - due to this program, the absence of girls from school has declined from 36% to 8%! On April 17th, a group from Trinity is going to meet at 12:40 at church, and will carpool to First Free to volunteer from 1:00 - 4:00. If you are a sewer, bring your own machine, and even if you can't sew a stitch, there is help needed cutting material, assembling kits, packaging, etc. - something for everyone no matter your skill set. John 20:19-22 NRSV


20:19 When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." 20:20 After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. 20:21 Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." 20:22 When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit.

Welcome to April, and the continuing celebration of Easter! Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again! It's a powerful story, and an empowering one for those who follow Jesus. Yet even in those first days of Jesus resurrection, his disciples remained in fear. Locked up tight, fearful of what might happen, fearful of the future, even with Jesus alive and not in the tomb. They were unable and unwilling to share the joy. How could this happen? Are we like the disciples? Are we locked up tight in ourselves and our schedules, so much so that we haven't shared the good news with our friends and neighbors? The good news is that Jesus meets us there, and gives us the Holy Spirit, the power to focus not on ourselves but on others. God has done the unimaginable – and now we who have received this good news are charged with going and telling the world what God has done in Jesus Christ! Go and tell! Go and tell! Go! Go! Go!

That's the deal. Go. Because Christ is raised from the dead, we go and share the good news with everyone in our lives, in the places we work, play and live. Our call is not simply to go to church. Our focus is outward, to the world. Go and tell. One of the best ways to do that in today's culture is through service. We serve others, showing people the love of God and proclaiming that Christ is alive in us! Service is not a church program, but a way of living. We do the things that Jesus did for the people around us. Why? In response to what Jesus has done for us! We're resurrection people! Imagine Trinity Lutheran, its people and its buildings, serving others needs in our community. Imagine loving our neighborhood, knowing our neighbors and asking them how God can bless them! Imagine the church not being for members but for the world! That resurrection vision has started to take hold at Trinity, and we're seeing the work of Jesus happen right before our eyes. It's starting to make a difference in our neighborhood and community. It's what happens when Jesus' disciples take the lock off the door and venture out in faith. It's what happens when people see themselves as being the church, not simply going to church! Our call is to Love God, love our neighbor and serve the world. Imagine church happening wherever you are, serving and loving others with the love of Jesus. Imagine the resurrection from the dead!

That's the good news! But maybe that's not your expectation. Maybe you're expectation is simply to go to church, get your religious goods and services there, and call it good. Guess what? Surprise! Christ has been raised, and that changes everything. Our outlook is outward. Go and tell, and speak God's love through serving our world. Can you hear Jesus calling your name? The Northside is anxious to hear from you – let's go! Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again!
