Northside Kids' Clothes Closet

Have you ever had a time in your life things were really stressful? Money is tight, lost a job, relationships aren't good, the kids are in trouble, a significant illness in the family, having a family member/members with special needs, couldn't afford the house/apartment or had to move for another reason, significant other left – these are many of the circumstances of the families that visit the Clothes Closet. It is a wonderful opportunity that the Clothes Closet volunteers have each week to let families know that there are people who care and are there for them. This is demonstrated not only by providing warm coats and boots, by being able to make sure the kids have a few pairs of pants and couple of shirts and new socks and underwear to wear, but also by treating them with love and empathy.

If you have access to a computer, take the time to watch a short YouTube video called Empathy vs. Sympathy by Dr. Brene Brown (it is a cartoon and definitely worth watching). This video shows how treating someone with empathy is different than sympathy – empathy is about making a connection with someone, without judgment. What if we all treated each other this way every day – instead of standing in line at the store with our face in our phone or eyes on the floor, we looked the person standing in line behind us and smiled? What if instead of getting upset when someone is short with us, we took a step back and thought maybe they have more on their mind than what is going on in the moment? What if instead of assuming negative things about someone based on the way they dress, talk, or how they look, we look for the positive things in each other?

The people of Trinity Church have definitely shown the love and caring that they have for their neighbors by the generous donations that were made to help the Clothes Closet get the Franke Foundation match – thank you all so very, very much! Because of your financial support the Clothes Closet will have over \$1000 to use to purchase socks, underwear, shoes etc. to be able to share with families in need. I want to thank Bev and Bill Schilla, who manage the Clothes Closet, as well as all of the other volunteers who work so hard to keep the shelves stocked and the families cared for.
