This is a version of the sermon Pastor Pupillo preached in worship on Sunday, December 24, 2017, at the 8:30am service.

The Fourth Sunday in Advent this year also happened to be Christmas Eve. So for Sunday morning worship, it was not quite Christmas, which felt strange. Sort of a moment inbetween. Life is made up of these in-between moments. We are not really comfortable being in the "not yet." We get off-kilter and decide to rush forward, making things happen "now." But, that's when it gets really strange. Even dangerous.

For instance, two parents certainly can't rush the birth of their child, just because they don't like the in-between time. Think of children who have been born early. We want kids to stay tucked in the womb until they were good and ready, right!? It is a healthy and necessary time, those moments in-between.

I think of 12yr old Mary, maybe she was 13. Already a young woman, and engaged to be married. She was not fully a wife yet, but becoming less of daughter to parents. She was transitioning from birth family to Joseph's and her family. It was a time of preparation, for learning ways to manage her home and family. I imagine she must have had questions as she got ready. She probably took some time for talking to friends and family about being a wife and a mother. A healthy and necessary time, those moments in-between.

And then the big announcement! When visited by the great angel, Gabriel, he said to Mary, "You have found favor with God! You will bear a son, he will be holy and called Son of God!" What was her first reaction to this news? Initially, upon Gabriel's arrival, she was perplexed. Then she pondered. Mary liked to ponder. (Maybe that's why she was chosen by God.) Then she questioned, "How can this be?" She was a virgin, after all. But, Gabriel assures her that God can do anything. Even her old cousin Elizabeth, who couldn't have children, *is now 6mo pregnant!* "For nothing is impossible with God," Gabe says. Mary finally comes forth with this response: "Let it be with me according to your word." The angel departed from her. And then she went to visit her cousin Elizabeth. In-between time, indeed!

Mary needed time for the baby to grow inside of her, yes. But she also needed time to wrap her heart and mind around all of this. She would be a wife, a mother, God's chosen, and she would be giving birth to the savior. To take all this in...to *act* in faith, and not *react* in fear...she needed time. A healthy and necessary time, her moments in-between. You and I need these moments, too. In anger we've learned to breathe and count to ten. In grief we've learned to remember, giving space for tears. Even in times of great joy, we learn to pause and count our blessings.

I mentioned that I think Mary pondered a lot. I think that has something to do with why God chose her. I think that's how God was able to work through her.

Gabriel came for a visit, and Scripture says, "Mary pondered what sort of greeting this might be." The shepherds came after Jesus was born, telling of their angelic encounter, and "Mary treasured these things, and pondered them in her heart."

Time in-between is healthy and necessary time. It's time to ponder.

We all need this time. We need time to think on a change or transition before it's fully formed. We need time to pray and ask for God's guidance. We need time to talk with family and close friends, so that we might deepen our understanding about things. This is what I believe this time of interim can be for all of us. I will be your interim pastor for 9 months. That's a pregnancy. Imagine what could be born among us in that time. So we take this healthy and necessary time, to honor the moments in-between. Trying not to rush, but to take our time. Do not rush the birth! Take time to think and pray and talk with loved ones.

Take time to imagine, hope and dream.

You are the body of Christ in this little corner of the world. May you experience new birth...but not quite yet. It's not time for the birth yet.

That's later. Welcome to the holiness of the in-between. May you be richly blessed. Amen.
