Galatians 5:1 NRSV "For freedom Christ has set us free".

Happy July! Summer is in full swing, and July begins with a celebration of freedom. July 4th is Independence Day, with fireworks and parades to celebrate our freedom as Americans. It's a great time of year, and a great time to reflect on the freedoms we enjoy.

Martin Luther spoke and wrote a lot about freedom too! In 1520 he wrote the treatise 'On the Freedom of a Christian'. In that work he summarizes the life of a Christian with these two propositions:

A Christian is an utterly free person, lord of all, subject to none.

A Christian is an utterly dutiful person, servant of all, subject to all.

In Christ, we have been set free! Free from sin, death and the power of the devil. Free from the worry of our eternity. Free from all that would say that we simply don't measure up in God's eyes. And it all comes to us as a gift! We are free by the action of Christ for us in his death and resurrection, received by faith alone. There is nothing and no one to whom we have to answer to. Christ has done it for us. We are free! Queue the fireworks!

Yet while we can and should celebrate our freedom from all those things that wear us down, that freedom comes with the opportunity to respond to what God has done for us in Christ Jesus. Because of God's love for us, because of God's grace poured out on us, because God has given us a gift beyond compare therefore we respond in kind. We are free to serve – serve our neighbor and not simply ourselves. In fact, God's love is so amazing, we're compelled to do it! Our freedom is a freedom that makes us subject to all. We have an obligation to serve our neighbor and share with them the love of Jesus that has been poured into our hearts through faith. You are free! Free to serve! Queue the fireworks!

Such is the Christian life. Freedom! How are you using your freedom to serve your neighbor? As you watch the fireworks fill the skies this time of year, drawing your attention to the freedoms we enjoy as American citizens, take that time to also reflect and give thanks to God for the freedom you have in Christ. Then make a plan to use that freedom in service to others. It's the Christian way of life, to the glory of God!


There is also a need for your empty egg cartons...but as always, anything given to the food pantry is much appreciated!

Monday's Meals is seeing some new faces in the kitchen. Bethel Lutheran and Shepard of the Hill Churches are exploring joining with the existing 6 churches who provide meals. Please welcome any new volunteers, if you are around in the kitchen and dining room on Mondays. The Monday's Meals leadership group has applied for a grant to help support the program as it continues to grow in numbers. Meals are served 59 times a year to 100-150 people. From 2003-2013 the number of Meals served ranged between 3600-3900. In 2014-2015 the meals served increased to over 5000 per year. What a wonderful service these churches are providing to our community members! Please keep this program and the people it serves in your prayers.
