In light of our congregational conversation on April 19th about the Church in the 21st century, I find it fitting that we re-visit my newsletter article of one year ago, now viewed within the context of that informational meeting. I pray the eyes of our hearts are enlightened, and we're open to the realities of being the Church in our culture today.

"And they devoted themselves to the apostle's teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." Acts 2:42

Such began the life of believers in Jesus. No buildings. No programs. Just gathering together to live this new life in Jesus. They gathered together in their homes, in the places they worked, at the places they played – wherever they were together. They met at different times too.

No set schedule, no 'one hour' requirement. Time and place weren't the important features of this new found life. Being together, praying, breaking bread, fellowship and attending to the Apostle's teaching, then living that in their everyday life, that's what mattered. Christians were known as 'Followers of The Way', a way of living that made a difference in their lives and in the world. That hasn't changed. But we sure have!

We now have come to believe that going to a building we call 'The Church' is the same thing. Going to church has become the hallmark of Christianity and the Christian faith life. Good Christians go to church, right? Ever felt guilty for not going? Ever been given a hard time by your friends for missing church? For centuries now, ever since Constantine made Christian worship legal in 313 A.D. and made it a hallmark of the culture, we've been encouraged to consider going to church as the mark of Christian faithfulness. While going to church is a great thing, over the years it's had some devastating effects on our world. Many people now simply go to church and call it good. They're satisfied with church attendance, and not concerned at all with living their faith in the world in which we live. Churches applaud this, by the way - Churches make attendance figures the measure of their success - the more people in church, the more successful they are as a church. But this kind of success, whether for the individual who attends or the church that marks attendance has led to a culture where Christians no longer make disciples. Christianity in America is in decline, and those who claim no religious preference is on the rise. The Church has been going to church for way too long! The call of Jesus is for us to make disciples, not simply go to church. As long as we're satisfied with going to church and not being the church, the future of the Church is in jeopardy. It's time for a change. It's time to be the church. It's time for you and me to be faithful in our lifestyles, loving our neighbors as Christ has loved us. It's time for Trinity to stop using numbers of people who went to church on a weekend as the measure of success, but rather use the number of growing relationships with people who are not Jesus followers as our measure of whether we're a successful church or not. Do you see the difference? Do you see God's call to you to live your faith and make a difference in this world? This is Kingdom work. This is what we're called to do and to be.

Going to church is great. Being the church is better, and our call from Jesus. Over the next months and years we'll be making the shift to this kind of understanding of what it means to be the church in the 21st century. The life of the greater church is at stake. It's that serious. Here we go!


