# A Message From Your Council President...

Hello Trinity Family,

It's a great day to be a member of Trinity Lutheran Church!

The weather is getting cooler, the leaves are starting to fall, squirrels are gathering nuts for the winter, and most vacations are done. Sure signs that the season is changing and fall is here. And by the time the next newsletter comes out it will be winter! Sorry if that scares you, but change is inevitable. It happens all the time. We just may not recognize it.

For the last few months I have done a little experiment during Saturday and Sunday services. Some members have caught on, and some may not have noticed. A few members have come up to me and asked why I am doing this. I told them because I want everyone to see some change at Trinity. Have you figured out what I did yet? Think hard about me at the services...what am I doing? Where am I at? What am I wearing? It is not about doing the readings, or what my clothes look like, or if I help the ushers. It is where I am sitting. I have had members come up and ask me why I moved, told me I was in their pew, and told me I was going to cause a stir. I hope I did. I even sat on the left side when everyone else was on the right side. Oh my gosh! How could I mess with tradition?

For so many years, Jennie, myself and our kids sat in the second pew from the front on the right side of church. I even introduced myself at a meeting in the basement once as the one that sat in that spot. Wow, was that nuts of me? But people knew who I was when I said that! Crazy! We liked sitting there because there were less distractions for our kids when they were young. And for me too! LOL! Why do you sit in the spot you do? Is it always the same spot? Or do you change to a different pew once in a while. Try changing your spot. See if anyone notices.

I remember when Pastor John Carrier from Winona was helping us out between pastors a couple of years ago. He had a rough voice one weekend and asked the Saturday service members in the back to move forward to the front half, or the front half members to move to the back half so he would not have to talk so loud. You should have seen the faces of everyone. They were not sure what to do. Finally, the back people moved forward, and have stayed in the front half ever since. WE CHANGED!! I do not mean that sarcastically, I say that with pride. If we can change where we sit, then we can change anything.

I wonder what God and Jesus were thinking when I kept moving pews every service. I hope they had a good laugh!

Jesus saw many changes when he was on earth; some good and some bad. There were changes in how people communicated with each other; like symbols in the sand (think about that one). There were changes in how people prayed to God, where they prayed, and who they prayed with. A revolution was happening as people got to know who Jesus was. His preaching changed their minds about who God was, and why He sent His son down to

On September 8th a Congregational Meeting was held to vote on extending a Pastoral Call to Laura Harris-Ferree for full-time pastor at Trinity. That vote was 72 yes, 26 no, and 4 abstaining. Since this vote was 70.7% and passed the 2/3rds needed per our Constitution, a Pastoral Call was sent to Laura through the Bishop's office. On September 17, 2019 I received word from Laura that she had decided to not accept our Call.

At this time the Church Council, Call Committee, and Pastor Libby from the Bishop's Office will be meeting on September 30th at 6pm to discuss the future of a new call.

Thank you everyone who participated in the meetings, social, and the congregational vote. We will keep you updated on any new progress with the call process.




